Sheffield City Trust is a charitable trust operating a variety of leisure facilities on behalf of the City Council. The first leisure trust to be formed in the UK, it has led the way for over 30 years through an unrivaled mix of sport, leisure and entertainment venues. With a bespoke HR system in place that lacked maintenance and could not keep pace with growth, the Trust identified the need for a replacement.
